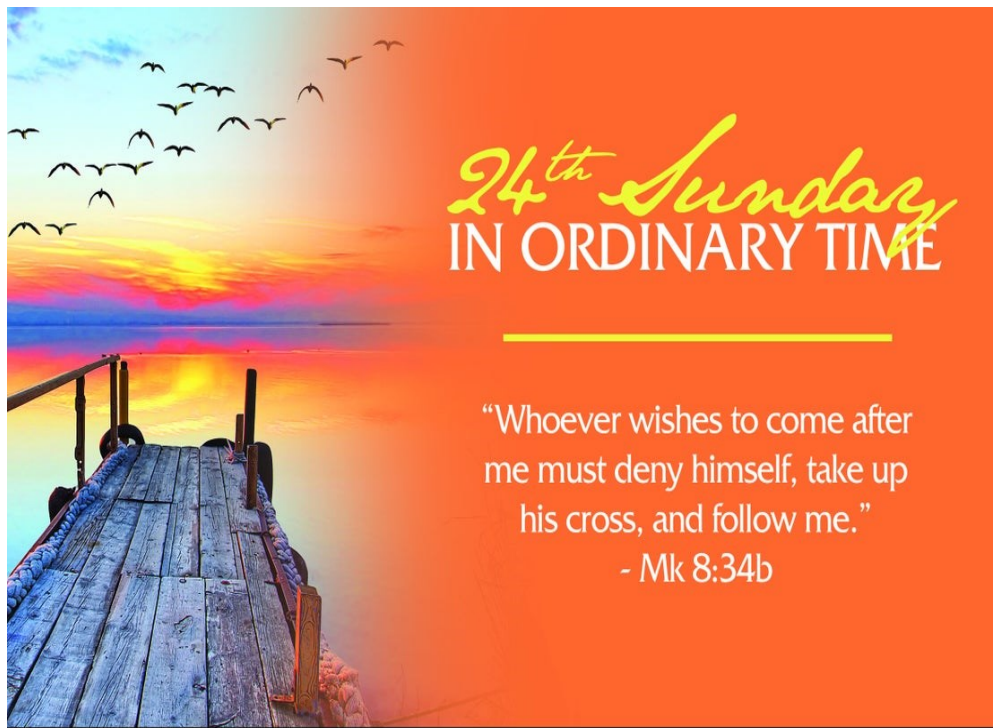

LIVE THE LITURGY - INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

Rest in the presence of God simply because God is God and you are you. This is all that is necessary. Out of this relationship will come inspiration, understanding, courage, constancy, truth, and virtues of all kind. We will find ourselves knowing the true meaning of things and developing a depth of insight that is not found following purely human venues. It is God who inspires and opens human hearts to see truth and beauty. In God, we understand all of our relationships with a richer appreciation and come to know who Jesus, who speaks of God's kingdom, really is. The trust that is fostered from resting with the Divine One allows us to see that God's ways are not our ways. There is something bigger going on in this picture of life. It is something mystical and magical that seeks to surprise us at every turn. It is not for us to cling to this world and its limitations. Our adventure is to dream bigger and brighter, realizing that it is even in suffering that the radiant light of the dawn will come. God's ways allow for our paths to be rocky, challenging, difficult, and even crippling at times. Purely human eyes cannot understand the 'why' of such experiences. The eyes and mind of God, however, reveal and detail a journey that ends in glorious resurrection joy. When we lose our axis and become too human in our thinking, Jesus rebukes us and gently reminds us how to see.

From Father Matt Flatley



In accordance with the Diocesan Pastoral Plan, our diocese is placing a renewed emphasis on the need for all Catholics to live as active stewards and disciples who receive the gifts of God gratefully in their lives, cultivate them responsibly, and then share them out of love with God and others. Living a life of active stewardship begins in the family, supports, and builds up our parish communities, and flows out into the world.

Recently, Bishop McKnight and Father Stephen Jones, diocesan director of stewardship, filmed a short video describing how families with students enrolled in our parish schools are called to practice active stewardship in their local community. School families, partnering with the parish to raise their children in the Catholic faith, are expected to live as active stewards who:

- **Pray:** Attend Mass faithfully in the parish on weekends and holy days.
- **Participate:** Use their time and talent to strengthen the parish community.
- **Sacrificially Give:** Pledge and remain current on a tithe of financial first fruits to support the ministries of the parish. The goal is eight percent to the parish and two percent to other worthy charities.

This video is currently being used by parishes in the first and second cohort of communities transitioning to the stewardship model over this year. These cohorts include 32 parishes and 18 schools. The remainder of parishes in our diocese will begin the process of transitioning to this model in July 2023.

Any parish not formally enrolled in the first or second cohort can already begin actively forming parishioners in the spirituality of stewardship and the expectations which come with living a life as active stewards.
