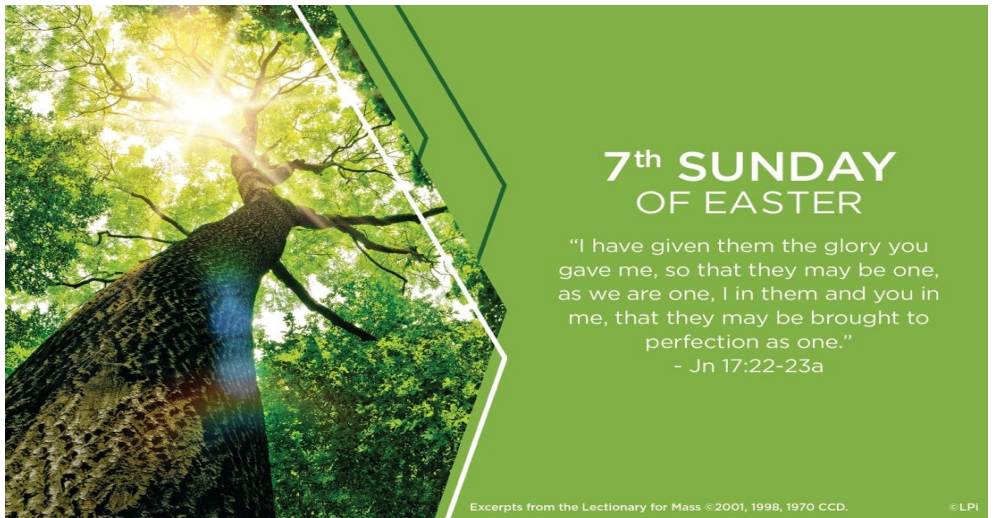

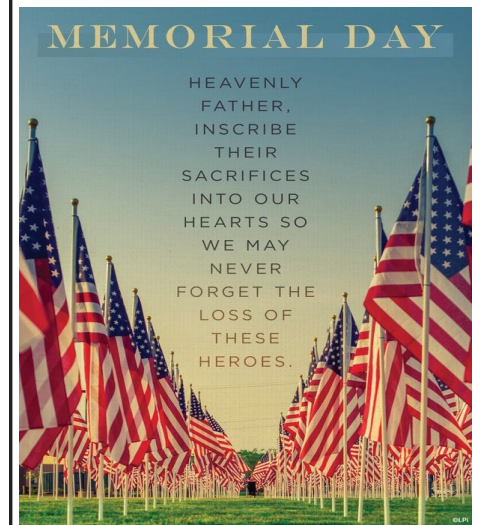

Building & Grounds Report

Building and Grounds Report: Sisters and Brothers, our Building & Grounds Committee and Finance Council Members, continue to discern the best ways forward with our various building's improvements and maintenance projects.

New Church Doors: We continue to sort out the new hardware and locks etc., but most of all, we are keeping a keen eye on any moisture problems. We agreed at our Town Hall that if any water issues continue to be a problem, then we will have to explore some sort of covering in the front of our church. In addition, the manufactures of the doors, remind us that they recommend a covering.

New Church Steps: As you may have noticed, we now have issues with our front steps into the church. Dale has engineered a temporary fix, which is perfectly safe and sound for the time being. Once we know how the new doors are doing with the water issues, we will have a better idea of how to correct the steps.

Water in the Church Lower Level: The basement of our church has always been damp and always will be. It will not ever be bone dry. However, there is a current issue that is concerning. There is more water than there has ever been, so much so, that we have standing water in some places. We are seeking out the counsel from a few professional companies who specialize in foundations and water issues. More information to follow.

The Two Parking Lots: Plans are underway to blacktop the small parking lot behind the rectory, and to level and pour concrete in the large parking lot next to the parish center. Let us hold all of these efforts in prayer. Fr. Matt
